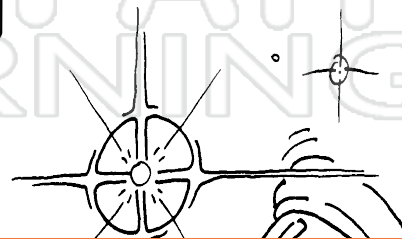
- A **minute** is named as such because it is a small or minute part of an hour.
- The Babylonians were responsible for hours being divided into minutes and seconds because their number system was based on sixties as well as tens. Thus we have  $60 \text{ minutes} = 1 \text{ hour}$  and  $60 \text{ seconds} = 1 \text{ minute}$ .
- A **second** is so called because it is the second time the hour is divided.

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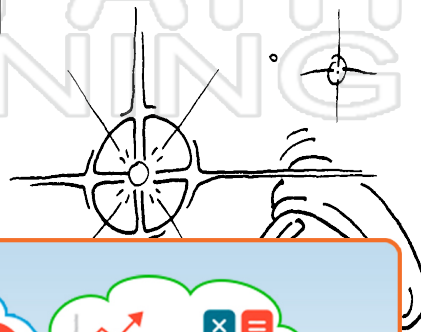
