

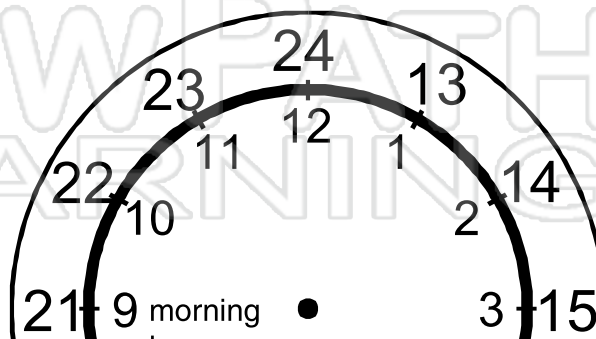

On a 12 hour clock each time is shown twice a day, 8:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m., 4:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m.

We use a.m. and p.m. to tell us whether the time is morning (a.m.) or afternoon (p.m.).

- Another way of telling the time, without a.m. or p.m., is the **24 hour clock**. This clock begins at midnight and reads the same as a 12 hour clock until midday.



- From midday the number of the hour continues to 24.
