

PLURAL ENDING -ES

What is the rule for adding -es to make a plural?

You know that most nouns are changed to plural when you add s. *Examples*: boy - boys, girl - girls

But some nouns need the -es to change to their plural form. Here is the rule to remember.

If a singular noun ends in s, ss, ch, sh, or x, add -es to form the plural. (Hint: when you say the plural you can hear an extra syllable.)
