What Is a Pronoun?

A **pronoun** is a part of speech that **takes the place of a noun**. The word that a pronoun **stands for**, or refers to, is called its **antecedent**.

Examples:

A **personal pronoun** refers to nouns that name people or things. The cell phone call is for *him*.

When a pronoun ends in the letters -self or -selves, it is known as a reflexive or
